The People

- 41.2 million Americans without health insurance
 - 10.1 million uninsured are poor
 - 3.3 million are near poor

 10 million seniors without prescription coverage





The Problem

 Those without prescription coverage pay the highest rates

 Many go without or take medications improperly to save money

 The result is that many who are poor and lack prescription coverage are putting their health at risk

The States



- States like Maine, Michigan, and Florida taking on the drug industry
- Smaller states developing buying cooperatives
- State-supported prescription assistance programs for seniors and others

 Efforts to establish a prescription drug benefit for Medicare recipients
